Ford Josephine Frances

1875-1965. Brought up at The Achers (now Achards) Rodborough, Josephine trained as a nurse at Gloucester General Infirmary and later lived in Cirencester. Remarkably, while Matron at a military hospital at Rouen in France in 1917, she had the sad task of writing to the parents of Kingscourt soldier, Ernest Chandler to inform them of his death. In the letter she mentioned her local connection and that her father had a business (cloth manufacture) at Lightpill. William Ford retired from the partnership of Lightpill Mills on the 30th June 1894 (Roberts, Jowlings and Co). Mr Charles Stephens would carry onthe business.
