He enlisted at 18 and was on reserve at the outbreak and working for Mssrs. Lewis the builders... he still thinks he will be over military age before the war ends, as he is 36 now... (he was) with PC Drake when he was killed and sent the sad news home to the latter's wife ... (he is) a humorous cuss and the best of good sorts...*

From a letter to the Clerk of Rodborough Parish Council:

“As you may have heard I am joining up the Royal Garrison Artillery (TF) and consequently I have wanted to come and see you re the Parish Council, and I have been meaning to do so each day, but as you will understand I have been frightfully busy and now I am off early tomorrow (May 6th). I suppose that I shall be away somewhat indefinitely, I ought really to resign the Chairmanship ... I believe the office become vacant if, like any member, the Chairman is absent for than six months, except in case of illness or some reason approved by the Council. Well I daresay the Council would approve my reason ...”

Mr Wyman said that he did not think that they required another Chairman, they had a good Vice-Chairman ... until Mr Gwynne Evans returned ...

Mr Harper said that he understood that Mt Gwynne Evans had said that when this opportunity arose of enlisting, he could not remain having taken a prominent part in recruitment meetings and the Tribunals and he (Mr Harper) considered he had shown one of the finest sporting examples of they could have by joining up in the ranks. He thought they should send him a message admiring his spirit and the way he had answered the call (hear, hear).
